## BUILDING & MAINTENANCE

LABM regularly commissions articles on a broad range of subjects including council project case studies, changes to the Building Regulations and industry initiatives, all of which need to be technical in content. Anyone wishing to submit an article for a feature in LABM should consult the following specification guidelines:



- In the first instance please contact the editorial team regarding the proposed feature and email across an article synopsis.
- All articles must be technical in their content, generic and as objective as possible.
- All articles must be relevant to LABM's target audience – as we only include case studies involving councils and ALMOs.
- All articles must be accompanied by a selection of high quality photography – schematic diagrams, step-by-step installation pictures, before and after photos and charts/tables. All pictures must be at least 300dpi and no smaller than 6 by 6cm. We regret that we do not include product shots with articles.
- As a general rule articles should be between 700 and 900 words long unless otherwise stated.
- All articles must be by-lined to a technical director or equivalent.
- Articles must be exclusive in respect of competitive titles.



**The deadline for articles is two months prior to the publication of the appropriate issue.**
